## Sports Report - 27.2.15 - Leicester City in the Community Cup

On Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> February our Year 6 football team took part in the Leicester City in the Community Cup held at Leicester City training ground. Our first two games in the group stage were both 3-0 wins; firstly against St Cuthberts and then Claybrooke. We followed that with another convincing Victory, 3-1 over Little Bowden. Our next group match was much more competitive and it was a close 1-1 draw with Abbey. In our final group game we beat Glenmere 1-0. At the end of the group stage our record was: W4, D1, L0, F11, A2, Pts 13. We topped the group by scoring just one more goal than Abbey!

In the semi-final we played Overdale. The team really upped their game and played some fantastic football. It's fair to say the players were determined and committed. We beat Overdale 2-1 to meet Abbey again in the final who had also won their semi-final against The Pastures. We continued with our fantastic form in the final and readily beat Abbey 3-1.

Following our triumph the winning teams of the other two winning teams from the tournaments held on different days, turned up for the grand finale - 3 teams playing first in a round robin.

In the first match we had time for a short rest and watched Broom Leys and Elizabeth Woodville draw 1-1. We then played Broom Leys and won 2-0. Next up was Elizabeth Woodville which finished in a 1-1 draw. This meant Elizabeth Woodville and ourselves had to play in the grand final.

After normal time the score was 0-0. After extra-time it was still 0-0. Penalties! It was very tense but fortunately we came out on top, 3-2. After 10 fixtures we'd finally won the whole tournament; in which 40 schools competed.

As a result of this win Danemill will now represent LCFC in the FA Premier League National Schools Cup - to be held at White Hart Lane in May.
